Unfortunately, for the past decade support for commonsense environmental legislation has split mostly along party lines. In the US House, Democratic lawmakers from California had an average score of 99%. Their Republican counterparts only averaged 5%, with the majority earning a 0 for their anti-environmental votes.



In the Senate, both Senator Harris and Senator Feinstein scored 100%.

California legislators are leading the way.

- **Representative Grace Napolitano** partnered with Representative Peter DeFazio (D-OR) to introduce the Clean Water for All Act*, a bill that will repeal Trump's Dirty Water Rule, in May.
- **Representative Jared Huffman** introduced the Oil and Water Don't Mix Act*, legislation that will protect our water from oil and gas pollution by closing loopholes and strengthening the landmark Safe Drinking Water Act.
- **Senator Kamala Harris**, introduced the Water Justice Act* which would invest \$250 million to upgrade our water infrastructure. The bill will ensure that the nation's water supply is safe, affordable and sustainable. It would also provide assistance for families struggling with their water bills.
