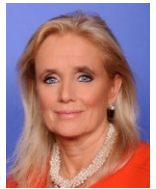

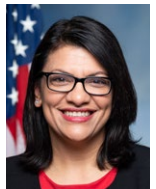

In both the Senate and the House these members of Congress put people first, have worked to hold the Trump administration accountable, and worked to address issues like reducing lead contamination in our water and ensuring that people have access to basic needs like water and power during this pandemic.



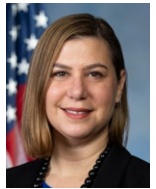
- **Representative Debbie Dingell** and **Representative Rashida Tlaib**, along with champions like Senators Kamala Harris (D-CA) and Elizabeth Warren (D-MA) introduced legislation* to protect consumers from water and other utility shutoffs during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- **Representatives Tlaib, Slotkin, and Kildee**, along with Representatives Cicilline (D-RI) and Moore (D-WI), introduced an amendment to establish a comprehensive lead service line replacement program and allocates \$4.5 billion annually for five years.
- **Representative Dingell** introduced the PFAS Action Act to require the US Environmental Protection Agency to designate PFAS chemicals as hazardous substances under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1980.
- **Representative Dan Kildee** and **Representative Brenda Lawrence** introduced the Water Justice Act* which would invest \$250 million to upgrade our water infrastructure. The bill will ensure that the nation's water supply is safe, affordable and sustainable. It would also provide assistance for families struggling with their water bills.



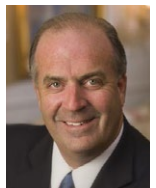
